CONDITIONS OF SALE

4-H & FFA Livestock Sale August 31, 2024

1. Livestock are offered for sale according to the laws of the state of Virginia. The highest bidder will be the buyer, and if any dispute arises between two or more bidders, the animal in dispute shall immediately be put up again for advance bids. If there is no advance, the animal shall go to the person from whom the auctioneer recognized the last bid. The auctioneer will decline any bids made by parties who have defaulted in former purchases or by persons, who in his judgment, are not responsible bidders.
2. **Terms of sale are cash; and payment in full must be made immediately following the sale unless other satisfactory arrangements have been made with the treasurer, Chris Biby, P.O. Box 281, Woodstock, VA 22664.** Checks must be payable to the **Shenandoah County Fair Youth Livestock Sale.** If you donated to the Gallon of Milk sale, please note that milk donations can NOT be included in your livestock sale payment. A separate check needs to be written to the *Shenandoah Community Foundation*, as noted on the gallon of milk invoice.
3. Livestock purchased during the sale become the property of the buyer at the time of purchase. Buyers are encouraged to remove the animals from the fairgrounds as soon as the sale is finished. Buyers must indicate the place of slaughter prior to the conclusion of the sale. If the animal is being returned to the floor, the buyer should write "Floor" in the space for slaughtering instructions.
4. **The 4-H/FFA Livestock Show and Sale Treasurer will not handle "buy backs" of "floor" animals.**
5. **No additions will be made to the bill of sale after the buyer signs the bill.**
6. Consignor must supply a two-day feeding ration and rope halter for their animals if requested by the buyer.
7. The Extension Agent, Show Manager, or designated representative must be contacted for release of animals. A release form, supplied by the clerk, must be presented before the release of animal(s). No animals may be removed from the Fairgrounds until the conclusion of the sale on August 31.
8. All animals have been graded by an official state grader of the Virginia Division of Markets.
9. A photographer will be available at the exhibit barn during the sale for buyer's pictures. We encourage buyers to come and be in a photo with the exhibitor immediately after the animal leaves the sale ring.
