Do You Have Un-used or Un-Wanted Pesticides? Virginia Department of Agriculture Pesticide Disposal Program to be held in the Shenandoah Valley

Virginia's Pesticide Collection Program assists agricultural producers, licensed pesticide dealers, pest control firms, golf courses, and homeowners with the proper disposal of unwanted pesticides. The program is an effort by the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS), with participation from Virginia Cooperative Extension.

Since its inception, Virginia's Pesticide Collection Program has collected and destroyed more than one million pounds of pesticides. Available at no cost to eligible participants, the program is supported by pesticide fees collected by VDACS. No general fund tax dollars are used to implement the program.

Steps to Participate

Step #1: Completion of a preregistration form detailing pesticides for collection is requested from all participants. The form is available at all Shenandoah Valley Extension offices or at the web site below. **Step #2:** Bring your pesticide to the locations listed below. Hours of operation are from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.

The Pesticide Collection Program requires participants to transport their unwanted agricultural and commercial pesticides to a central collection site where the hazardous waste disposal contractor will package the pesticides for eventual disposal. If a participant cannot safely transport unwanted pesticides, the program may make arrangements to containerize the pesticides for transport (these arrangements must be made in advance).

Emergency Preparedness for Avian Influenza Fit Test Clinic

Tuesday, August 23

Over the past several years the process of managing an avian influenza outbreak on farms has evolved. In most cases, in-house composting of the mortality will be preferred option. In order to complete this process, there needs to be personnel who are skilled at operating machinery in chicken houses who are familiar with the process. In most cases the people who are best able to do this work are farmers, poultry litter brokers, and others who routinely clean out poultry or turkey houses. One of the biosecurity requirements is that workers wear respirators and other personal protective equipment (PPE). The purpose of this clinic is three-fold. First we will offer respirator fit testing to farmers, poultry litter brokers, and related people who want to be fit tested. Second, we will have some of the other PPE available so people can see the type of clothing they will be ask need to wear while working on these farms. Third, we will provide an introductory education to the composting process.

People who wish to be fit tested will need to complete a medical clearance form with their doctor in advance. Please call the Extension Office at 540-459-6140 to get that paperwork.

Highlights of the Day

- Fit Testing on Respirators (full face, half face and N-95's) will be offered by Gemplers, the Shenandoah County Emergency Operations Center and the Virginia Department of Health.
- Gemplers, the Virginia Department of Agriculture, and the USDA will

- Virginia Cooperative Extension and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality will give an overview of the composting process.
